A woman who is set to become the first Irish person to travel to Space has revealed she has faced sexism as she pursued her incredible career. Dr Norah Patten said she is determined to inspire young girls not to be deterred by sexist stereotypes and to follow their dreams.

Norah (34) told Independent.ie: "The whole area of Space has always been absolutely fascinating to me." Norah studied aeronautical engineering in University of Limerick before she completed a PhD in Aeronautical Engineering, but she admits that

she has faced some discrimination because of her gender.
